On Saturday, June 1, 2024, our museum located in the Robert & Electa Waddell House will open for the season with a celebration that includes extensive new exhibits and live blue grass music performed by local artists.

Meanwhile, behind the scenes we will continue restorative work on the Wevertown landmark.

We will repair, glaze and paint some 23 windows, clean and cap the chimneys and silver coat the house roof. Simultaneously operating a cutting edge museum while restoring the house is an ambitious approach and to be frank, we need your help.











We are committed to preserving

our rich local history. This past winter we presented an event in Tannery Pond Community Center dedicated to local participation in the 10 th Mountain Division during World War II. The program was done in conjunction with Fort Drum and presented to a packed house of more than 120 people.

Our new exhibits will focus on the people of Johnsburg, their occupations and facets of everyday living including period clothing, and a new Map Room. The 10th Mountain exhibit will be another new feature of the museum.













Events happening at the house this season will include:

June 1—Our opening day celebration with old time music, lunch, and our 50-50 drawing;

June 12—Unveiling of our newest historic marker made possible by a grant from the William G. Pomeroy Foundation at the Dunn Mansion on South Johnsburg Road;

July 20—A program by Eileen Egan Mack on Jeanne Robert Foster's poetry and life;

August (date tba) - History Tea presented by Gem Radio Theatre;

September 14 – History Weekend (see page 2);

September 21—Katie Cross's buff mittens with Carol Pearsall;

Beginning genealogy with Town of Johnsburg Historian, Deana Wood; and more. Dates to be announced soon.
